Dear audience,

How can art inspire change, foster dialogue, and deepen empathy? These are questions that guide our work.

At all levels of the company's artistic practice, we are committed to exploring how art can empower individuals, challenge the status quo, and offer new perspectives.

I am excited to share the two new creations for 2025 featuring the 14 dancers of the company.

HOW ROMANTIC is a new piece by Greek choreographer Katerina Andreou, set to premiere on March 6th. It is a highly physical and sensory performance that delves into themes of human labor, authenticity, and the complexities of relationships and power dynamics.

Inspired by Pollack's film *They Shoot Horses, Don't They?*, it emphasizes endurance, resistance, and the essential support offered by partnership between dancers and the empathetic connection forged with the audience.

Movement unfolds as a living organism, while music plays a crucial role focusing on the audience's emotional and sonic experience.

Through poetic and rhythmically absurd scenes, the performance blends strength and fragility, fueled by collective energy and mutual support. The title carries an ironic twist, challenging traditional ideas of romance and audience expectations. CANCEL BERTHA by renowned Belgian choreographer Jan Martens premieres on May 22nd.

Martens' work unfolds as a dynamic tapestry where tradition, innovation, and cultural relevance seamlessly intertwine. Renowned for his thematic explorations, he creates spaces that celebrate individuality while fostering connections. Using rhythm structures, musical scores, and mathematics as a foundation, he creates a thought-provoking and playful performance that balances structure with spontaneity.

Together, these creations enrich our repertoire, offering audiences a varied and engaging artistic experience while celebrating the innovative spirits of *Katerina Andreou* and *Jan Martens*.

Additionally, we are excited to tour three pieces from our repertoire during spring 2025.

The 2023 creation *BIRGET; WAYS TO DEAL, WAYS TO HEAL* by Sami artists *Elle Sofe Sara* and *Joar Nango* returns to Northern Norway, where the project began.

We are delighted to perform the piece at the Sami National Theater Beaivváš and at Alta Kultursal in early February. Winner of the 2023 Norwegian Dance Critics Award, the piece approaches political engagement with sensitivity.

Sara and Nango subtly invite us to join a community and begin the healing process of a traumatic history between the Norwegian and the Sami people. MONUMENT 0.10: THE LIVING MONUMENT by Eszter Salamon has been acclaimed at major European festivals, including Ruhrtriennale, Festival dÁutomne and Julidanse. In 2025, it will be presented at the Théâtre National Wallonie-Bruxelles, at Théâtre de la Ville in Paris, at the Lyon Dance Biennale. Salamon won the Hedda Award for best costume design in this mesmerizing piece.

We continue our collaboration with Eszter Salamon, developing a new project with Folk Film and Studio ES. LANDSCAPING, a video installation, draws inspiration from natural landscapes, dissolving the boundary between nature and culture. Filmed around Bergen, it merges choreography with seashores, mountains, forests, and glaciers. Bodies, colors, and materials form performative paintings, enhanced by music and cinematic techniques. This collaborative work, supported by partners across Europe and Norway, will premiere at the Lyon Dance Biennale in 2025 and be presented at KODE Art Museums and Composers Homes as part of Bergen International Festival in 2026.

Following a successful 2024 tour in Switzerland and France, SOVACO DE COBRA by Brazilian choreographer Lander Patrick travels to Festival Italicá in June. Lander crafts a hypnotic symphony of movement, juxtaposing drama and joy. The precision of movement and musicality shape both the composition and meaning of the piece.

These performances will be accompanied by several complementary encounters between the company and the audiences, such as artists talks, dance or

discussive workshops, and screenings of a documentary film that give context to the performances.

We believe in the importance of extending the experience of the art forms beyond the performances, and we are happy to engage our skills and human resources to make it happen.

HOW ROMANTIC is a marathon with no finish line – a sprint towards something intangible.

HOW ROMANTIC is a deeply ironic commentary on how we experience struggles of life as a spectacle – both in their grand gestures and smallest details. We witness an intense marathon, echoing the dance marathons during the Great Depression in the US.

There are no winners or losers – only 14 seasoned dancers, in couples, alone, or as a herd of horses, negotiating their way through movement and sound in a relentless choreography. Through feats of strength, joy, and fatigue, they urge each other in an energetic mix of abandon and rigorous discipline. It's a collision of order and chaos in a fevered search for something real.

HOW ROMANTIC creates space for reflection – on power and relations, intimacy, forced entertaining and maybe the role of love as the ultimate finishing line for any race, even when it feels unattainable. 

CANCEL BERTHA moves to its own rhythm - a playful blend of energy. curated chaos, and unexpected creativity. The performance reflects Jan Martens' signature approach: reimagining dance as a space for individuality, connection, and subtle humor. Scenes flow seamlessly from one moment to the next. blurring the boundaries between moments of ecstatic group energy and sequences of suspended intimacy.

In CANCEL BERTHA, music isn't always what you hear—it's what you see and feel. True to Martens' fascination with rhythm, structure, and music scores, the dancers' movements become their own soundscape. Silence holds as much weight as motion, and patterns emerge with geometry in delightful ways.

CANCEL BERTHA is bold without being brash, playful, yet precise. It's a dense dance evening that draws inspiration from polyrhythms and a love for layered storytelling. The Carte Blanche ensemble crafts a performance that balances the poppy, the avant-garde, and the deeply human.

In recent decades, several Western countries have set up commissions to investigate the history of minority groups subjected to systematic state abuse.

BIRGET; WAYS TO DEAL, WAYS TO HEAL is a response to the Norwegian Truth and Reconciliation Commission, which in June 2023 submitted proposals to reconcile the Sami and Norwegian people.

Birget is a Sami expression that describes a state of mastering or surviving in a changing environment. Driven by birget, Sara, Nango, and Carte Blanche invite the audience to overcome the fear of touching a heavy and challenging topic with a frisky performance that questions social and political boundaries, limitations, and today's climate of reconciliation.

In SOVACO DE COBRA (English: snake's armpit), we invite you into a world where the social rules are underpinned by an unfair game which gives arbitrary and brutal results.

Using the angle of chess – informed by his fascination with the duality of this strategic and warlike game – Patrick creates an energetic performance where new rules emerge, and the pieces of the game are challenged.

SOVACO DE COBRA is made for nine of Carte Blanches dancers who throw themselves into the game with warmth and vitality. The performance is full of virtuosity, and sharp and crisp movements; and the dancers orient themselves in a whirlwind of rhythms, tempo, and playfulness.

MONUMENT 0.10: THE LIVING MONUMENT creates a world based on colour and slowed movement.

In a magnificent scenography the audience is taken on a meditative journey through vibrant tableaus in a dreamlike universe where time almost stands still. *THE LIVING MONUMENT* invites the audience to slow down and immerse themselves in the sensory impressions and figures that appear in the endless landscapes on the scene.

In the performance, the theatrical elements are equal and interdependent, and it develops into an installation of sound, movement and figures. The landscapes on stage makes a space for sensing and wonder, and the slow transitions between colours, grand scenography and detailed costumes make for a strong and unique visual experience.

Under the artistic direction of the French choreographer Annabelle Bonnéry, the company commissions choreographers involved in social questions and who express themselves through dance.

Bonnéry has expanded the company's artistic offerings to includes an additional program aimed at diverse audiences as part of its audience development and sustainability focused framework for touring. Carte Blanche also offers dance workshops, after talks and occasionally short films in conjunction with their evening performances.

The director also turns to artists concerned about the encounter between different artistic fields.
